Opioid Prescriber/Dispenser subcommittee met October 10, 2017.

We discussed:

PDMP at length.

Pharmacists reporting daily

Dashboard – feedback to prescribers

Lock in prescribers/dispensers

PDMP:

Nancy Bishop:

Pharmacy reports cleared by 2 a.m. the next morning.

Currently sharing information with 15 states

New system coming on line December 12

New system will provide dashboard (feedback to prescribers) after 1st quarter of 2018.

Includes benzo and opioids

Currently prescribers pay \$10/year generating \$183K

Pharmacists pay 25 cents per phone call.

Cost to run system:

Year one \$1.1M

Year two: \$1.2M

Year three: \$1.4M. Level for next 3 years.

Will run out of money FY '19

Discussed raising provider fee to cover costs, Eg: \$100/yr = \$1.8M.

The cost of the basic program and NarxCare will remain constant for at least 3 years. The cost for EHR integration through Gateway will ramp up for 3 years. There should be no cost increase after year three other than the usual 3%-7% increase that normally occurs. We will run out of funds to cover PDMP costs beginning in FY '19.
